## *Against Poverty and Unemployment*

### HENRY GEORGE CONGRESSES

Held each year since 1926 under the auspices of the Henry George Foundation of America, the national Henry George Congress serves as a medium for considering questions of policy, for discovering the most efficient methods of propaganda, and for inspiring individual Georgists to greater zeal for the common cause.

### LECTURES

Continuing an educational activity that has been unremitting since the founding of the Henry George Lecture Association in 1903, distinguished and able speakers are placed before leading audiences throughout the United States and Canada vividly presenting Henry George's message in its current social, economic, and political aspects.

### REGIONAL RALLIES

Series of regional conferences in the form of Single Tax Get-to-Gether Dinners are arranged in important cities to feature public discussion of Henry George's proposals, to enlist the active participation of civic leaders, and to foster local initiative in the forming of local organizations and in advancing legislative programs.

### POLITICAL ACTION

With the view to prosecuting a Victory Campaign of real significance to the Henry George movement, forces are being mobilized for intensive political action in some city or state where constitutional requirements will permit a thorough-going fundamental advance.

### LITERATURE

Leaflets, pamphlets, and directories are prepared and published for general distribution by the national organization, while Mr. Maguire, Assistant Secretary, directs the activities of a widely used national bureau for the distribution of Georgist literature.

### PUBLICITY

Advance publicity and prepared news articles are furnished newspapers on speakers, regional conferences, and the national Henry George Congress, while a letter-writing corps comprising leading Georgists is in constant activity.

### NATIONAL HEADQUARTERS

Offices at Pittsburgh and Chicago serve as clearing houses, through which are co-ordinated a nation-wide Georgist activity—the national and regional conferences, the lecture tours, political action, and the preparation and distribution of literature and publicity.
