BULGARIA

Mr B. Guduleff writes to say that the new Bulgarian translation of *Progress and Poverty* has received further favourable reviews in a number of prominent journals—for instance, in the *Political*, *Social and Economic Journal* edited by the ex-Minister Dr P. Djidroff, the article being written by Professor Iv. Kinkel; an enthusiastic review in the weekly *Izgrev*, published in Nova-Zagora; reviews also in *Pladne*, daily paper of a section of the Agrarian Party; and in another organ called *Jitno Zarno*. But the most striking and influential of these reviews is that by Professor Ganeff of the State University in Sofia which appeared in the *Juridical Journal* (March-April, 1933), for a translation of which into English we are indebted to Dr E. B. Haskell.

The cause in Bulgaria has gained the active support of the political weekly journal *Le Kaval*, appearing in Plovdiv, one of the organs of the peasants' party. In nearly every issue it has articles that bring the Henry George teaching to bear upon the problems of the day. This propaganda

is of great value.

At Plovdiv, from 3rd to 5th September, the Vegetarian Union held its Annual Conference. Nearly all who took part in the discussions showed more or less acquaintance with the ideas of Henry George and supported them without reserve. It was decided at that Conference to transform and reorganize the "Communist Colony" established by the Vegetarians near Plovdiv into a "Cooperative Georgeist Colony" constituted like the "Enclaves" at Eden, near Berlin, and at Liéfra in France.

The Co-operative weekly journal Svoboda (Freedom) is

another great strength to the cause, to which it continues

to give liberally of its space.

The Committee in charge of the proposal to establish this new co-operative Georgeist Colony includes Mr St. Peneloff, Founder and President of the former Henry George Foundation in Bulgaria; Mr Y. Kovatcheff, Vice-President of the same Foundation and translator of Henry George's works; and Dr L. Karaivanoff, who was Treasurer of the Bulgarian Henry George Foundation.
