Will of Bolton Hall Gives Residue to School

Bolton Hall, lawyer, author and exponent of the Henry George single tax theory, who died at Thomasville, Ga., on Dec. 10 in his eighty-fourth year, bequeathed his residuary estate and \$2,000 to the Henry George School of Social Science, 30 East Twenty-ninth Street. This was learned yesterday when his will was filed for probate.

Mr. Hall left his personal effects to his widow, Mrs. Susie Scott Hall of 20 East Eighty-third Street. In his will he explained that his wife and daughter, Mrs. Lois Herrick of 18 East Eighty-third Street, already had been well provided for.

Specified, however, that if within six months after the probate of his will, his daughter should be in need of financial aid and desired the whole or part of the residuary estate, the executors were to turn over to her so much of the net as in their judgment seemed fair and equitable and that the bequest to the school be diminished accordingly. She receives a legacy of \$5,134 under the will.
