PSYCHOLOGY tells us that there are certain fairly well defined psychological types, and all individuals fall under one or another category. If individuals, why not nations? Blithely ignoring the pitfalls of generalization and the screams of protest from every school of thought, I present herewith my catalog of various nations and their psychological types.

Egypt: *Epileptoid*. Goes for a long time without a ripple, then suddenly breaks out into convulsions. During its seizures, is apt to do some seizing. Throws a fit every 2000 years. Has been trying to annihilate Israel for 4000 years. Has delusions of grandeur. Gets along well with the phoboid type.

Russia: *Phoboid*. Full of fears and suspicions. Imagines that planes are flying over its polar regions. Also suffers from Beria-Beria and Yugoslavitis. Persecution complex coupled with desire to conquer the world. Owns or controls one-fourth of the land surface of the earth but feels hemmed in.
