## Abel Brink

Sad news from Denmark reports the death, last month, of Abel Brink, one of the leading disciples of Henry George in that country. As editor of GRUND-SKYLD, organ of the Danish Henry George Association, as speaker, writer, worker, Mr. Brink was weli-known among Georgists in Denmark and other countries. His death, in the early fifties, is a severe loss to the cause.

A few years of his young manhood were spent in the United States, working on a farm in the West. He went back to Denmark, studied at the University, entered Government service. In 1920 he became a member of the governmental Valuation Commission, underta ing the special task of Land Valuation. A small, slight, quiet man, never pushing himself forward, lacking in so-called "personal magnetism," he soon became all-important in the fine work done by our Danish friends.

GRUNDSKYLD, amid many obituary articles by his fellow-Georgists, tells that not long before his death Mr. Brink expressed the wish to have carved on his gravestone the words: THE LAND FOR THE PEOPLE. A group of his friends, led by Mr. J. L. Björher, are taking up a collection to have this wish ful-G. I. COLBRON filled...
