My dear Boy:

Yours o yesterday recd.

I think u shd b carefull abt send= ur letter to e Chicago News by Thursday. It might make trouble for u with ~~other~~ papers that are nt to publish e letter till Sunday if it were published in another paper on a previous day, though I do nt think it wd make much differenc~~e~~ if it were published in a weekly paper exclusively.

I wd keep send= out ~~letters~~ circulars, as those u send out at first were vy far from exhaust= e field. Change e new circulars, so as to be in by stat= e papers t u now have.

We start at 3 to-morrow afternoon. Am sorry Jen is nt go=. Do nt think we will b away more than four or five weeks. Will then come down to see you. There is a cable to e Bermudas, & a weekly mail, leav= ~~NY~~ on Thursdays & arriv= on Sundays, both ways.

I return e clippings. Have not got anything fm Romeike yet, bt expect some to-morrow.

Nordoff writes me a very warm letter. Have nt seen Young.
