The Henry George Foundation had its birth at the Benjamin Franklin Hotel in Philadelphia in 1926, when we celebrated the birthday of Henry George at his birthplace. Let's rededicate ourselves in 1949 by making a practical pilgrimage to the City of Brotherly Love where our great philosopher and founder was born in 1839.
