ST. LOUIS AFL-CIO TEACHERS ENDORSE SITE VALUE REVENUE

Al Katzenberger, Treasurer of the St. Louis Teachers' Union, AFL-CIO, gave a workshop for fellow members on "the decent way" to pay for schools and other public services. The films, For the Land Is Mine and A Tale of Five Cities, were viewed and discussed. Al, who is a board member of the Public Revenue Education Council (PREC), had proposed a resolution to the Teachers' Union, Local 420, on August 22nd, endorsing a lower real estate tax rate on buildings and higher rate on location values.

According to Stan Frederiksen, Ex Officio of PREC, "the resolution has been adopted by the local St. Louis group, and has been forwarded to the national teachers union organization, which will introduce it, and likely pass it, at the next national convention, about a year from now."
