The Path to Prosperity. By GILBERT M. TUCKER. New York: G. P. Putnam & Sons, 1935. Pp. viii+312. \$2.50.

Under this hopeful title the author inveighs against government regulation of business, "the land monopoly," and present methods of taxation. In this collection of comments and somewhat disconnected notes on a great variety of topics, there is a frequent outcropping of the familiar arguments for the single tax. The author fails to synthesize the many different topics discussed in the book into a consistent theory of social reform.
