Henry George Foundation of America

Due to a request by Federal officials that all non-essential conventions be skipped this year because of transportation difficulties, the Foundation has been considering dispensing with the 1942 Annual Congress. However, a final decision has not yet been reached, and the Foundation has been urged from several quarters to hold the Congress. It is felt that important developments and problems—among them the part of Georgeists in the war and postwar world—warrant the uninterrupted continuance of the Congress.

Mr. Percy R. Williams, executive secretary of the Foundation, writes that, while the officers and directors have not yet reached a decision, they now have under consideration a suggestion that a Congress be held in Boston in November. No details are yet available. By our next issue we will no doubt have a more complete announcement. Meanwhile, Mr. Williams invites ideas and suggestions as to how a successful gathering may be planned. "We know it won't be easy this year," writes Mr. Williams, "but if our friends are interested, we will put forth our best effort."
