

**EISENHOWER AND GEORGE**

The following extract from the recently published biography of General Dwight Eisenhower, *The Man from Abilene*, has received wide notice in the United States: "In the Spring of 1950, when he [Eisenhower] was an elector to the Hall of Fame, he was confronted with a choice between Henry George and Stonewall Jackson. He chose the former." As many prominent Americans (including our correspondent, J. Rupert Mason) point out, when a top-ranking military man picks for the Hall of Fame a great libertarian and land reformer like Henry George in preference to one of America's most-beloved and brilliant generals, *that is news*. And when the choice is made by the man who may be the next President of the United States is news of prime significance.
