

Henry George Not Socialist

In a report of a dinner of the Robert Schalkenbach Foundation celebrating the 104th anniversary of the birth of Henry George in THE NEW YORK TIMES of Sept. 3, the author of the single tax theory was referred to erroneously as an "American Socialist." "Henry George was never a Socialist," Otto K. Dorn, trustee of the Henry George School of Social Science, explained yesterday. "He believed in individual initiative and enterprise, rather than a socialized state, which is a planned economy governed from the top."
