

LAND PARTY NAMES ITS CITY CANDIDATES

Eleven Delegates Pick Salesman for Mayor—Call for Aboli- tion of All Taxes.

Eleven delegates of the Commonwealth Land party, meeting yesterday at their headquarters, 3 East Fourteenth Street, decided not to endorse the Socialist party in the coming elections, and nominated their own candidates for three city offices.

Laurence W. Tracy, a salesman, 58 years old, who lives at 28 West Twenty-sixth Street, was nominated as candidate for the Mayoralty on a platform which asks for land restoration to the people and the abolition of all taxes. His running mates are Morris Van Veen, maker of signs, with Levy & Co., and residing at 583 Riverside Drive, for President of the Board of Aldermen, and Charlotte O. Schetter of 21 East Ninth Street for Controller.

According to Tracy, who is chairman of the New York section of the party, as well as a member of the national executive committee, the next step will be the circulation of petitions, to which 3,000 signatures at least must be affixed within three weeks, and the raising of \$500 for campaign funds.
