JOHN SHERWIN CROSBY, lawyer, editor of "The Primer" said to have been the earliest of single tax periodicals, in which he predicted the combinations now known as trusts, recognized the public's inalienable ownership of things naturally public, advocating their exclusively public control, and maintained, as he still holds, that the grant of corporate power for any purpose private or quasi-public is an abuse of the civil power, 1884; author of "Government, An Inquiry Into the Nature and Functions of the State," 1896; platform speaker and occasional writer on economic and political questions; has lectured extensively throughout the United States and Canada on the single tax and other subjects involving principles of government and the doctrine of natural rights.
