For Just System Of Taxation

Editor, Sunday Star: The people of Wilmington will have the opportunity on June 2 to vote for a candidate for Mayor, Dr. Henry George III, who believes in equal rights for all and special privilege for none, and in a government by and for the people.

In his practice as a physician he realizes that many physical ills of the human body are caused by economic ills. Likewise a city has many ills among which are the slums and from which others spring and all are due to economic causes.

Dr. Henry George understands the cause and knows the remedy for these conditions and if elected he will endeavor to have laws enacted that will improve the city materially, morally and financially.

A new industry is to be established near Wilmington, the General Motors assembly plant, and 3,000 people are to be employed. This was considered such important news that it was broadcast over the radio, and large headlines were used in the newspapers.

If the city were to have a business administration and a just system of taxation, many industries could be induced to come here, then prosperity would follow and Wilmington would become a model for others to emulate.

Wilmington could become such a city under a genuine democratic administration as advocated by Dr. Henry George.
